HIST-UA 161: Early Modern Britain Spring 2022: TR 9.30-10.45 7 East 12th St., LL23

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Description

This course introduces students from all majors, schools, and years to British history during the Tudor (1485-1603) and Stuart dynasties (1603-1714). Across these two pivotal centuries, an initially Catholic, monarchical, and provincial polity emerged as Protestant, parliamentary, and imperial. In exploring these developments, we will learn about such topics as include Henry VIII and the Protestant Reformation; the age of Queen Elizabeth and William Shakespeare; English imperialism within and beyond the British Isles; and the contest between crown and Parliament.
